Students will gain hands-on experience in a number of trades area including Carpentry, Automotive and Metalwork. Projects and activity will be practical and will involve making, creating and problem-solving. This course will help to prepare students to enter the world of work with the skills, attitudes, and sense of responsibility necessary to be successful.

AILIN WONG is a Technology Education Teacher who has been with the VSB since 2008. She grew up in East Van and graduated from Britannia Secondary School. During her grade 12 year she participated in and completed the Secondary School Apprenticeship program, receiving her Red Seal endorsement as a Automotive Service Technician, Ailin decided to go back to school and get her teaching certificate. IMPROV CAMP FOR ELEMENTARY SCHOOL STUDENTS – JULY 2 - 5



With a focus on positivity, group mind, and the fun that comes with saying "YES!", the Intro to Improv Intensive is a four-day camp that will focus on introducing students to the basics of improv comedy, from character workshops, to scene work, to performance-ready short form! Participants will develop confidence and self esteem, skills that are essential to being successful in their daily endeavours. By the end of the week students will have developed meaningful relationships with their peers. They will preform in front of an audience on a daily basis and will have an opportunity to present their work during the showcase week in September.

AIDAN PARKER is a Vancouver-based actor and improvisor. He is a graduate of Templeton Secondary's Theatre Temp program and continues to perform in film and theatre. Aidan is an active, award-winning member of the Vancouver Improv Community. He won the bronze-medal at the Canadian Improv Games National Tournament and performed as Vice-President of UBC Improv in festivals across Canada, including an award-winning performance at Montreal's 2018 McGill Improv Summit. He is currently a cast member of Instant Theatre's Fistful of Kicks, an all-Asian improvised martial-arts comedy, and recently headlined the



Improvised Play Festival in Austin, Texas. He is the lead instructor for the Arts Club's After School Drama Club at Britannia Secondary, a camp counsellor at Improv camp, and is the improv coach for Templeton's Improv team.

FILM CAMP FOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS – JULY 2 - 11



This 8-day program will explore the creative process through character development and filmmaking. With a focus on developing strong storytelling skills, and working with high quality film equipment, participants will work in small collaborative groups to brainstorm, script, shoot and edit a short digital story or film. Final projects will be screened at the end of the program and upload to the After-School Film Program's Vimeo channel, so they can be shared and entered in student film festivals.

Dream Big Productions and After-School Film Program

Created in 1998, Dream Big Productions is the home of Templeton Secondary School's Media Arts program, which includes secondary level classes in Film and Animation and the very successful The After-School Film Program (ASFP), an advanced film program for students who are passionate about filmmaking and want to create films with mentorship from working industry professionals at all stages of the production process. Since its inception in 2001, the films produced in the ASFP win multiple awards every year in both local and international film festivals including the prestigious All American High School Film Festival in New York City and the BC Student Film Festival. ASFP films screen to thousands of people every year and are regarded as some of the best student-produced work in the country. Most of the students that participate in the After-school Film Program go on to collaborate in post-secondary film programs and careers in creative industries. We'll have several peer mentors from ASFP joining us for this camp.

FILM CAMP INSTRUCTOR

CORIN BROWNE was in high school when a counsellor suggested that her generation should be prepared to face up to five distinct career shifts over their lifetime. Rather than feel like she was losing out, Corin's reaction was deep relief that the future held multiple possibilities and could be crafted from personal passion, curiosity and hard work. Fast forward twenty-five years, and Corin wears three distinct but related professional hats; media producer, community engaged artist and film and animation teacher. With an academic background in critical media education (BA and



MA Communication, SFU) and digital production, Corin has been working as a community engaged artist for over 15 years. In addition to independent film work, primarily in documentary and news magazine formats, Corin is also the co-artistic director of Housing Matters Media Project, founding member of the nationally recognized Summer Visions Film Institute for Youth and was the resident filmmaker at Templeton Secondary where she joyfully mentored young media makers for an entire generation. Corin's projects have ranged from a low- watt pirate television project to Bollywood-style PSAs educating farmworkers about pesticide contamination and large-scale, installation projects exploring the impact of the housing crisis on young artists and youth living in government care. Corin is also a certified secondary public school educator and is thrilled to be working alongside long-term mentor Jim Crescenzo as the Media Arts and Animation teacher at Templeton Secondary School. Young Moviemakers is an award-winning acting and film program for children and youth ages 5-18. Using high end, professional grade equipment, participants learn the importance of visual storytelling, scriptwriting, acting, editing and more, through the production of a short film. With the help of our experienced instructors, participants work in groups to develop and produce their films, which is then premiered in front of family, friends and the community.

Many Young Moviemakers alumni launched into careers in Vancouver's prestigious film industry both behind and in front of the camera, such as starring in programs produced by Netflix and Disney.

In 2017, Young Moviemakers was awarded with the BC Job Makers Award and in 2019 they won the Small Business BC Award for their Community Impact. Young Moviemakers is often considered the best program of its kind in Canada and in 2019 their co-founder was honoured as one of "B.C.'s most enterprising young business leaders" in the BC Business 30 Under 30 list.

Young Moviemakers works with over 1000 youth annually and the films made by students have won more than 100 film festival awards worldwide, including Best Overall Film at the 2017 TIFF Young Filmmakers Showcase.

The founders of Young Moviemakers are both former East End Boys Club members and credit both their careers to the opportunities they received from the EEBC.

Mike is currently the Head Instructor for the Teen Shakespeare Program with Carousel Theatre for Young People on



Granville Island, as well as an adjudicator of Speech Arts in B.C. and Alberta. Mike is a graduate of the Studio 58 Professional Theatre Training Program at Langara College.

BC Camp Choice offers a week-long summer camp at the beautiful Zajac Ranch, located in Mission, BC. The camp is designed to educate a group of youth on leadership, respect, teamwork, responsibility, and courage.

On its pristine 44-acres, the Zajac Ranch will host members of the Boys Club and the Girls Club from August 6th to August 10th. The group will meet at Templeton Secondary School at 9:30am where buses will transport the group of 50, 25 Boys Club members and 25 Girls Club Members, to the beautiful 5-star ranch, owned by philanthropist Mel Zajac. During the camp, the group will take part in exercises and lectures that have been adapted from courses utilized in leadership training seminars and personal development classes. The week-long program will build self-esteem, develop self-confidence, and provide a skill set to overcome adversity and embrace new, positive personal concepts and ideas.

There is no cost to youth to attend the camp and the total amount has already been raised. The value of the entire program, including accommodation, program and registration costs and transportation, works out to approximately \$80,000.

The youth have the opportunity to build confidence and courage through talent shows, theatre workshops and outdoor leadership challenges. The BC Camp Choice Society is a registered not-for-profit organization that supports The Camp Choice program and challenges youth through art projects and creative outlets.
